Mobile phone masts, Wi-Fi and schools

The Stewart Report (2000, 2005), commissioned by the Government, recommended that the beam of greatest intensity from a mobile phone mast antenna should not fall of any part of a school's grounds or buildings without the informed consent of the school and parents

Pupils and teachers sit close to the transmitters contained within wireless computers and their bodies absorb some of the radiation emitted

DNA has been found to be damaged in human cells after 4 hours exposure to a wireless laptop. The WHO have classified the radiation emitted from Wi-Fi transmitters as a possible carcinogen.

Wi-Fi transmitters in schools expose children to similar or more radiation to that from a mobile phone mast near a school



Some people experience immediate symptoms such as headaches, nausea, dizziness or heart palpitations

Wired Ethernet or fibre optic connections do not emit microwave radiation
